PASTOR'S NOTES

Christ is risen, alleluia! This week, I'd like to talk about Mass intentions. The Mass is the highest form of prayer that is offered to God since it is the sacrifice of Jesus being presented to God the Father. Therefore, it is meritorious to have Masses said especially for the deceased to release them from purgatory. Here are some good things to know about Mass intentions and how they work. When a Mass is offered for someone, the merits of the Mass are applied for that person even though the Mass itself will be the usual Mass for that day with its own readings, prayers, etc. The priests have a book in the sacristy with all Mass intentions listed there and the priest signs off on it acknowledging that he said the Mass for that intention. Mass intentions are usually offered for the deceased, but they can also be offered for living persons or even particular causes such as "for an increase in vocations to the priesthood" or "for reparation of sins against the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus." Mass intentions are just as effective in any of the following scenarios: 1) On whatever date it is scheduled. An anniversary date may be significant to the person requesting the Mass intention, but the Mass intention is still just as effective even if not scheduled on that exact date. 2) If it is said by any priest. 3) If it is offered at another parish than the one requested. 4) If the one requesting the intention is not in attendance at that Mass. 5) If the Mass intentions are not stated publicly at Mass. 6) If they are not stated by the priest at Mass (weekend Mass intentions are stated by the lector during the Prayers of the Faithful). 7) If they are not listed in the bulletin. 8) If a Mass intention is mis-stated or not stated out loud. Rest assured that the Mass is still being offered by the priest for the intention that was scheduled for that day.

Other things to know: Mass intentions are customarily a \$10.00 stipend which is an offering of gratitude to the priest who is offering the Mass. It is not necessary to give that if one is unable to make that offering. The giving of the stipend does not give someone a "right" to hear the name announced. When scheduling Mass intentions, we will do everything we can to accommodate your request. However, if we cannot accommodate your requested date, please know that it is still commendable to request your Mass intention to be on whatever date is available or even if it has to be scheduled at the other parish. The spiritual value of the Mass being offered is what is most important. If you have any further questions on Mass intentions, please let me know.

It made the choice seem obvious to me. I didn't have one life-changing moment, but looking back, it's interesting to see all the little moments that were directing me here. 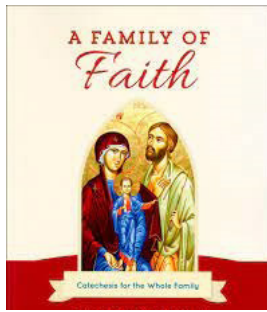

A note to let you know how all your donations and volunteer hours help in giving aid to our less fortunate people in Marion.

The pantry served 2,494 clients in the first three months. DEL PÁRROCO

Cristo ha resucitado, ¡Aleluya! Esta semana me gustaría hablar sobre las intenciones de la Misa. La Misa es la forma más elevada de oración que se ofrece a Dios ya que es el sacrificio de Jesús presentado a Dios Padre. Por lo tanto, es meritorio que se digan Misas especialmente por los difuntos para liberarlos del purgatorio. Aquí hay algunas cosas buenas que debes saber sobre las intenciones de la Misa y cómo funcionan. Cuando se ofrece una Misa por alguien, los méritos de la Misa se aplican para esa persona aunque la Misa en sí será la Misa habitual para ese día con sus propias lecturas, oraciones, etc. Los sacerdotes tienen un libro en la sacristía con todas las intenciones de la Misa que se enumeran allí y el sacerdote la firma reconociendo que dijo la Misa por esa intención. Las intenciones de las Misas se suelen ofrecer por los difuntos, pero también se pueden ofrecer por personas vivas o incluso por causas particulares como "por el aumento de las vocaciones al sacerdocio" o "por la reparación de los pecados contra el Sagrado Corazón de Jesús". Las intenciones de la Misa son igual de efectivas en cualquiera de los siguientes escenarios: 1) En cualquier fecha que esté programada. Una fecha de aniversario puede ser importante para la persona que solicita la intención de la Misa, pero la intención de la Misa sigue siendo igual de efectiva incluso si no está programada para esa fecha exacta. 2) Si lo dice algún sacerdote. 3) Si se ofrece en otra parroquia distinta a la solicitada. 4) Si la persona que solicita la intención no asiste a esa Misa. 5) Si las intenciones de la Misa no se declaran públicamente en la Misa. 6) Si no las declara el sacerdote en la Misa (las intenciones de la Misa del fin de semana las declara el lector durante las Oraciones de los Fieles). 7) Si no figuran en el boletín. 8) Si la intención de la Misa está mal expresada o no se expresa en voz alta. Tengan la seguridad que la Misa aún la ofrece el sacerdote por la intención que estaba programada para ese día.

Otras cosas que debe saber: las intenciones de Misa suelen ser un estipendio de \$10 que es una ofrenda de gratitud al sacerdote que ofrece la Misa. No es necesario dar eso si uno no puede hacer esa ofrenda. La concesión del estipendio no le da a nadie el "derecho" a escuchar el nombre anunciado. Al programar las intenciones de la Misa, haremos todo lo posible para satisfacer su solicitud. Sin embargo, si no podemos acomodar la fecha solicitada, sepa que aún es recomendable solicitar que su intención de Misa sea en cualquier fecha disponible o incluso si tiene que programarse en la otra parroquia. El valor espiritual de la Misa que se ofrece es lo más importante. Si tiene más preguntas sobre las intenciones de la Misa, hágamelos saber.

Desde entonces, me he quedado en casa con mis hijas, Elizabeth (5) y Anna (2). También llevo la contabilidad de nuestro negocio agrícola familiar. En mi tiempo libre, disfruto leyendo ficción y no ficción, y estoy aprendiendo a tejer. Convertirme en ama de casa fue toda una transición para mí y luché por encontrar una comunidad. Probé un par de grupos de madres locales, pero no

eran exactamente lo que estaba buscando. Después de sufrir un aborto espontáneo en 2020, me sentí perdida y comencé a buscar respuestas. También me costó mucho celebrar la Navidad y la Pascua con mis hijas porque se sentían muy seculares y yo sabía que no deberían serlo. 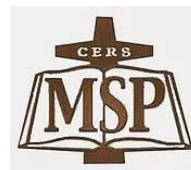
